EMBLEM

On a disc per bend Azure and Vert, in front of an olive wreath in base Or two lightning bolts conjoined in bend throughout Gules, fimbriated Yellow, surmounted by a torch upright Argent, detailed Sable, enflamed Proper, all within a diminished border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "100TH SERVICES SQUADRON" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "DIVERSITY IS OUR STRENGTH" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The torch symbolizes the strength, vigilance and generosity of the unit while providing esprit de corps to others. The lightning bolts indicate the Squadron's readiness to effectively support operations in times of combat and peace.
