The mission of the 101st Security Police Flight is protecting eight KC-135E for the Strategic Air Command. In addition to guarding priority resources, the Law Enforcement Section provides Pass and ID services, reports and analysis, investigations, base patrol and resource protection.

In 1972, members of the 101st Security Police Flight were guarding F-101 on alert as well as a nuclear storage area for Air Defense Command. During the same time frame, Bangor was chosen as a test site for "Pave Safe." Although the program was short lived at Bangor, the experience gained from the project proved valuable to future security systems used by the United States Air Force.
