104th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron (Type F) was activated on 31 October 1950 under the command of MAJ Alfred P. Mallet. The home of the 104th AC&W was Fort Preble, South Portland, Maine. The 104th was called to active duty for 24 months on 1 September 1951, and performed duty at Otis AFB, Massachusetts, and Wheelus AFB, Tripoli, Libya. The 104th was relieved from active duty and inactivated on 1 September 1953.
