Mission Support Squadron consists of two flights and three sections: Mission Support Flight, Security Police Flight, Personnel, Social Actions, and the Base Still Photographic Laboratory. The Mission of the Mission Support Squadron is to provide mission essential personnel support and services to the ten deployment ready units and 1000+ members of the 107th Fighter Interceptor Group.

Section activities include Recruiting, Base Career Advisor, Customer Assistance, Personnel Affairs, Quality Processing and Administration, Photo Documentation, Official Portraits, Photographic Special Duty Assignments, Official Passports, Human Relations Education, Affirmative Action Programs including the processing of Discrimination Complaints and Alcohol and Substance Abuse Programs. The Mission Support Flight is involved in activities related to Data Operations, Radio Operations and Maintenance, and Visual Information Services. The

Security Police Flight is charged with Air Base Security and Law Enforcement.

The Squadron's current organizational make-up reflects recent reorganizations. One of the most significant of these changes was the reassignment of the Food Services Section to the Civil Engineering Squadron. Traditionally the Food Services Section has been with the 'Support Squadron' throughout the Unit's existence. The reorganization also included a name change from Combat Support Squadron to the current title of Mission Support Squadron.
