OPERATIONS On Dec. 1, 2009, the 108th was redesignated as the 108th Wing in acknowledgement of its new missions. The 108th Contingency Response Group was added to the wing as was the 204th Intelligence Squadron. Brig. Gen. Michael L. Cunniff, commander of the 108th Wing, said, "The

excellent people that make up the 108th continue to stand out and show the Guard and the Air Force what a great job we do." The 108th CRG is only one of two such groups in the Air Guard –

the other is in Kentucky – and one of eight in the continental U.S., with three more spread throughout the world. The CRG is the Air Force's rapid entry force designed to assess and open an air base, perform initial airfield operations and ensure a smooth transition to combat sustainment. According to Col. Robert Brazel, commander of the 108th CRG, the group will do noncombat evacuations, humanitarian relief operations, and disaster response as well as full spectrum war airbase opening.
