OPERATIONS

The 113th Air Police Squadron was federally recognized with three officers and 55 enlisted. It was activated on 18 Jan 1951 and assigned to the 113th Air Base Group.

113th Air Police Squadron was inactivated on 6 Feb 1952.

As of 1 Jan 1953, the 113th Fighter Bomber Wing was assigned the 113th Air Police Squadron.

Because of the Berlin Crisis in Germany, as of 1 Oct 1961, by direction of the President, under authority conferred by Public Law 117 of the 87th Congress, the 113th Air Police Squadron ordered to extended active duty for 12 months, unless sooner relieved by proper authority, at Andrews.

As of 1 Aug 1968, 113th Air Police Squadron was inactivated.

As of 6 Aug 1968, the 113th Air Police Squadron was redesignated the 113th Security Police Squadron, and assigned to Tactical Air Command for activation on or about 18 Aug. It was also reassigned to the 113th Combat Support Group.

On 15 Jun 1970, the 113th Security Police Squadron was inactivated and allocated to the National Guard Bureau.

In June 1993, the security police from the 113th participated in the Silver Flag exercises at Nellis. Approximately 40 security police practiced air base defense in the Nevada desert.
