1949 saw the addition of the 114 aircraft control and warning squadron established at Opa-Locka Florida as part of the Florida air National Guard.

19 August thru 2 September 1951 saw the residue of the Florida air National Guard home station units on annual training at Orlando Air Force Base Florida. This included the 114 Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron (Type F) and some air section personnel assigned to

headquarters.

On 1 November 1951 the 114 Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron (Type F) was inducted into active federal service.
