# **EMBLEM**

On a disc Azure, in front of a cloud formation issuant from dexter base Argent, an Orange charged with a fleur-de-lis Or, a Pegasus rampant of the like detailed Sable, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "ET MARTE ET ARTE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged

with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "123 AGS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Pegasus in Greek mythology was the bearer of Zeus' divine lightning. The clouds signify the air mission, with the fleur-de-lis describing the standards of accomplishment expected of the unit.
