OPERATIONS 1960 On March 31 the headquarters of both the 123d Tactical Recon Group and the 123d Maintenance and Supply Group were inactivated. As of April 1 the 123d Field Maintenance Squadron was redesignated as the 123d Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron (CAM), and

the changes also included activation of a new unit, the 123d Armament and Electronics Maintenance Squadron. Commander of the CAM squadron was Lt Col William H. Robertson and the commander of the A&E squadron was Maj Charles B. Robertson.

March 31-April 1 1960... The 123d Tactical Reconnaissance Group and the 123d Maintenance and Supply Group were inactivated as of March 31. On April 1 the 123d Armament-Electronics Maintenance Sq was activated and the 123d Field Maintenance Sq was redesignated as the 123d Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Sq.
