140th Mission Support Flight Commanded by Maj. James L. Jesser, this is a new unit which combines several functions of the old combat support squadron and the communications flight.

Customer Support Section: Headed by MSgt. John B. Flowers, and previously known as base administration, this branch oversees all COANG "paperwork" procedures including training administrative personnel. Theirs is a unique management function dealing principally with the

written word; it all adds up to better communications up and down the chain of command, including all tenant units assigned. Duties include mail, reproduction, publications (distribution and maintenance) and files maintenance. This section is also responsible for training on the utilization of new micro-computer systems and other basewide computer systems. A mainstay of the section was SMSgt. Joyce Saitta, who was one of the first females to join the Colorado ANG and responsible for much of the success of the section over the years. MSgt. Debra Reiboldt now carries on the tradition established by SMSgt. Saitta.

Communications Maintenance: Headed by SMSgt. Robert Goode, this section is responsible for the maintenance of audio visual, radio and computer equipment in support of the base and wing.

Information Processing Center: Most familiar to users as the old "data processing section," this function, headed by MSgt. John Hartman, is responsible for all computer operations on Buckley ANG Base and produces the vast majority of all base computer listings and related products. Audio-Visual: This part of the information support branch under NCOIC MSgt. Donald Stephenson works closely with the squadron operations and training branch and is also responsible for the base's closed-circuit televised productions.

The CBPO and other elements of the 140th MSS are primarily responsible for people programs, making certain COANG personnel are ready, trained, qualified and utilized to their potential. Computerized for the most part, accuracy and currency of stored information is the working goal of those who are assigned. Although removed from the operational scene, theirs is a most important job.
