The 154 Weather Flight, located at Little Rock AFB, AR, in building 207, Suite 211, has a total authorized strength of 15 personnel. The unit has one full-time NCO and is comprised of three officers and 12 enlisted members. The mission of the 154th Weather Flight is to deploy authorized resources and supporting assets to specified locations within 72-hours, and to provide 24-hour tactical meteorological services to a U.S. Army Separate Infantry Brigade. The

154 Weather Flight is currently tasked to provide a team of one officer and four enlisted members to Arkansas' 39th Infantry Brigade (Separate), Louisiana's 256th Infantry Brigade (Separate) and Oklahoma's 45th Infantry Brigade (Separate). These teams are attached to the Intelligence Section of the brigades. They provide 24-hour meteorological services to include tailored weather products for the brigade commanders' staff, chemical section, aviation assets and other units as requested.
