Its first and present commander is LtCol Paul G. Cohen, an Omaha businessman who also functions as the deputy commander for resources for the entire group. 155RMS encompasses

supply, comptroller, data services, contracting, and commercial transportation. Ninety-one men and women make up the 155RMS.

The resource management squadron is the current home for activities which, over the last twenty years, have been in a variety of settings.

Supply, for example, moved from the 132ABG on 1 July 1960 to the 155th Materiel Squadron. The first commander of that squadron was the unit's chief of supply, LtCol Roger D. Charles who retired in 1972.

On 13 November 1965, supply became the 155th Supply Squadron under Major Gale S. Summers. Summers, who retired in 1976 as a lieutenant colonel, passed command in 1971 to Major Donald M. Kronberg who was followed by LtCol Albert L. Nolan later the same year.

The supply squadron was disbanded on 30 July 1973, and supply personnel moved to the 155th Combat Support Squadron under LtCol Nolan who, before retiring as a colonel in 1974, served as deputy commander for logistics and chief of supply.

Supply moved briefly to group headquarters on 1 October 1978. It became part of resource management on 1 July 1979.

Commercial transportation and contracting (formerly known as procurement) were part of the materiel squadron through 1965. When supply became a separate squadron in that year, commercial transportation and contracting moved to combat support, remaining there until reorganization realigned them with supply in group headquarters in 1978 and resources in 1979.

Comptroller and data services began with group headquarters in 1960. They transferred to combat support in 1964 and remained with that squadron until the realignments of 1978 and 1979.
