The squadron is responsible for the public safety of base members and the safety and security of the wing's C-130 fleet and facilities. The squadron manages the wing's information and personnel security, combat arms training, criminal investigative support and traffic safety. Squadron personnel work with wing leadership, the Judge Advocate General, Air Force Office of Special Investigation, Air Mobility Command staff, and federal, state, and local police. Members

are trained to respond to state emergencies including natural disasters and domestic terrorist acts and participate in state and federal emergency preparedness exercises and home station training. Squadron members completed a six month deployment to the Middle East in the period shortly after 9/11.
