EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a silhouette of a unicorn Argent, exhaling a breath Or, striding over a globe gridlined of the second and tilted bendwise Gules, surmounted by a delta to sinister of the like, fimbriated and trailing three orbits bendwise sinister depicted as lightning flashes, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border

and inscribed "MOUNTAINEER PRIDE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "167TH COMMUNICATIONS FLIGHT" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The unicorn represents the parent wing, the 167th Airlift Wing. The lightning flashes and delta represent all branches of the Flight and illustrate the synergy achieved as they work as a team and form a single, unified, fighting force, ready to serve worldwide. The globe indicates the worldwide scope of the unit's mission.
