

### **EMBLEM**

A winged skull in a circle. The One Hundred Sixty-eighth Aero Squadron was a Corps Observation squadron. It was assigned to the Fourth Corps Observation Group, First Army, on September 30, 1918, and reached the Front at Toul October 5th, following. It was engaged in operations of the Argonne-Meuse, first and second offensives. It accomplished many war missions and reconnaissance's over the German lines, gaining much valuable military information, fought several combats and received official confirmation for two victories. It suffered no casualties and ceased operations (May 11, 1919)
