EMBLEM

On a disc Celeste, a divider tool extended Sable, winged Or, detailed and edged of the second, between in chief the silhouette of General George Washington facing sinister of the like

garnished of the field, and in base a fireball Gules, flaming to chief Tenné, all within a diminished border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "BUILD MAINTAIN PROTECT" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "192D CIVIL ENGINEER SQ" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged compass represents all civil engineering specialties. The fireball symbolizes fire safety and rescue missions. The profile of General George Washington is a reminder of dedication, selflessness, liberty and freedom.
