EMBLEM



On a disc divided one third light blue above two thirds blue by a white nebuly horizontal line, three white stars, one above two, in dexter chief and one star in sinister chief; in dexter base a scarlet flight symbol ascending emitting a white contrail arcing to base below a scarlet wrench

and screwdriver in saltire and connecting with the star in sinister chief; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached below the disc a white scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The aircraft returning to earth for preparation for its next flight (symbolized by the crossed wrench and screwdriver) signifies the mission of the unit. The three stars, the partial circle created by the aircraft contrail and the one star indicate the squadron's numerical designation. The largest star also denotes the unit's Air Force Outstanding Unit Awards. (Approved, 21 Oct 1988)

OPERATIONS

Part of the 301st team of maintenance "workhorses," the Periodic Maintenance squadron was activated on June 16, 1952 from authority of Fourth Air Division General Order number 13, dated 16 June 1952. Source of personnel was the 4212th Organizational Maintenance Squadron, which was inactivated on the same day. Mission of the organization was to support the wing aircraft maintenance organization by performing periodic inspections on all wing assigned aircraft and perform other maintenance scheduled by the Wing Chief of Maintenance.
