EMBLEM

Azure, two lightning bolts in saltire or behind in pale an Indian spear, head argent, shaft of the second and feathered proper, overall an annulet argent winged of the second and encircling a pomme. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and AF Yellow are the colors traditionally used by the Air Force. The two lightning bolts symbolize speed, while their position in saltire indicates strength. The Indian spear alludes to the unit's location as well as the [Republic F-105] Thunderchief aircraft. The pair of wings, a flight symbol, in conjunction with the white ring suggests the striking ability of the 301 (Tactical) Fighter Wing. The green disc symbolizes an island and represents the unit's World War II service in the Pacific Theater.

Group will use the wing emblem with the group designation in the scroll.
