EMBLEM

302d Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron emblem: On a fusil azure, bordure gold, a pile, point to base argent, surmounted by an annulet gold in fess point, crossed by an open-end "wrench in fess of the last. The basic design is in the ultramarine blue and golden orange of the Air Forces. The annulet is symbolic of the base of operations and the squadron personnel's unending devotion to duty. The open-end wrench is indicative of the operational function of the squadron. The annulet and the wrench are mounted on the pile, which is the heraldic symbol for

a solid foundation. The three divisions formed by the background and the pile, the annulet or "0", and the two charges on the fusil form graphically the squadron designation, "302".



302 Combat Support Squadron emblem: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The disc is divided light and dark to reflect the Squadron's round-the-clock readiness capabilities. The winged globe with aircraft markings resting on a column suggests the unit's support of the global Air Force mission. The lightning flashes allude to unit personnel's rapid response to mission demands. The sword represents military preparedness. The olive branches suggest peacetime defense.

The 302d Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron was constituted November 20, 1940, as the Base Detachment, Gray Field, Washington, and made active January 8, 1941. It was redesignated as the 302 Air Base Squadron, January 13, 1942, and as the 302d Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron, June 13, 1942.
