EMBLEM

The Caduceus heralds to the staff carried by Hermes in Greek mythology. It is universally accepted as a symbol of healers. The cross is recognized as a symbol of medical services. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. The Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of the Air Force as well as the charity of the healthcare professionals who staff the 307th Medical Squadron. The Yellow of the Caduceus symbolizes the member's excellence in all they do and loyalty to their patients. The Silver of Hermes' wand represents the clear conscience and charity of the oaths these professionals swear as healers. The Red of the cross represents the blood of life. The black of the lettering, edges and Caduceus represents our dignity and determination in our mission to save and preserve life.
