2873 Test Squadron emblem On a light blue disc, an argent volant falcon is positioned at Fess point. A gules, argent and ultramarine azure strip extends from The falcon's head through its body to the sinister point on the disc. An argent estoile is placed above the falcon's head at slightly above Dexter. The disc is bordered with or. Two argent scrolls, also Bordered with or are attached above and below the disc. The one above Is blank and is reserved for the unit's motto. The one below is Lettered with sable and bears the unit's designation, "san Antonio Flight test." **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design. Blue symbolizes the sky, the primary theater of air force operations. Yellow symbolizes the sun and the excellence required of air force Personnel. The white falcon, shown in flight, symbolizes strength and The arena of flight. The red, white, and blue stripes are the nation's Colors and are used to symbolize speed. The white star also symbolizes The nation and the premier test squadron known as the San Antonio flight test. (Approved, 9 Apr 1989)
