Operations. Activated in Feb 1942 and arrived a year later in the Middle East. As the only troop carrier unit in the area, operated with Royal Air Force, Middle East (Desert Air Force) after Rommel's defeat at El Alamein. Transported supplies and evacuated casualties in support of

the Allied drive across North Africa. In May 1943, began training for the invasion of Sicily. Dropped paratroops over the assault area on the night of 9 Jul.

Transported reinforcements to Sicily on 11 Jul and received a Distinguished Unit Citation (DUC) for the mission although severely attacked by ground and naval forces. Received a second DUC for supporting aerial and ground operations in Egypt, Libya, Tunisia, and Sicily during 25 Nov 1942-25 Aug 1943 by transporting reinforcements and supplies. Participated in the invasion of Italy by dropping paratroops over the beachhead south of the Sele River on the night of 14 Sep 1943.

In Feb 1944, moved to England to prepare for the invasion of France. Received a third DUC for dropping paratroops near Ste-Mere-Eglise on D-Day 1944 and flying reinforcement missions on 7 Jun 1944. Dropped paratroops during an air attack on Holland in Sep 1944 and Wesel on 24 Mar 1945 when the Allies made the airborne assault across the Rhine River. While not engaged in airborne operations, transported supplies such as ammunition, gasoline, water, rations and evacuated wounded personnel to rear-zone hospitals. Returned to the US in May 1945; trained with transport aircraft; conducted joint training exercises with the Army Airborne Forces.

Transferred, without personnel and equipment, to Japan on 15 Nov 1954.

Between 1955 and inactivation on 18 Jun 1957, conducted intra-theater airlift in aerial supply, aeromedical evacuation, special airlift operations, special air movements and unit air movement.

Tasked with military airlift mission in NW Pacific, 1978-1989.

During 1992-1994, was responsible for aircraft generation, cargo/passenger processing, aeromedical evacuation, and command and control of all strategic, commercial and selected intra-theater missions at Yokota AB, Japan and Andersen AFB, Guam.

Mission of 316 ALSG to provide aircraft generation, passenger/cargo processing, and command and control of all strategic, commercial contracts, and selected intra- theater missions at Yokota Air Base, Japan And Andersen Air Force Base, Guam.

Managed 1 Helicopter Squadron which supported Washington D. C. capital area airlift for the Executive Branch, high-ranking dignitaries and military leaders, and other VIPs, 2006-1010.
