EMBLEM

316 Troop Carrier Wing: Azure, nine parachutes argent, three, two, three, and one, all within a bordure per bend or and gules. (Approved for 316 Group on 17 Aug 1951 and for 316 Troop Carrier Wing, 14 Dec 1965)

316 Wing: Azure, a stylized Capitol Dome in chief Argent, and a stylized griffin segreant in base Or, within a bordure per bend of the third and Gules, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "316 WING" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Capitol Dome represents the Wing's mission as protectors of the National Capitol Region. The griffin represents the death defying vigilance and bravery of the unit's Airmen as well as their role as defenders of both the sky and land, as the griffin in heraldry has properties of both the eagle (master of the sky) and the lion (king of the land). Participated in joint airborne training, glider training, exercises and maneuvers, and ferried freight in the United States and overseas, 1947-1948, and again in 1948-1949.

Participated in worldwide tactical airlift operations, humanitarian missions, and special exercises and maneuvers, including joint airborne training, 1966-1975.

Conducted C-130 replacement training, Jan 1966-Nov 1967, and C-130 maintenance training, Feb-Dec 1966.

In 1973, participated in repatriation of South Vietnamese and American prisoners of war from North Vietnam.

From 1980-1991, 1776 Air Base Wing (ABW), as host wing, operated, administered and maintained Andrews AFB, MD. 316 Wing, as host wing, operated, administered and maintained Andrews AFB, MD, 2006-2010. Supported official capital area helicopter airlift, 2006-2010.

The Air Force last week shifted its historic 11th Wing from Bolling AFB, D.C., to JB Andrews, Md. The unit assumes the duties of Andrews' 316 Wing, including Presidential support. On 1 Oct, Andrews officials inactivated the 316 Wing and activated the 11th Wing. The 11th Wing's transfer occurred as part of the BRAC 2005-mandated merger of Bolling with Anacostia Naval Station, creating JB Anacostia-Bolling, D.C. Completed on 30 Sep, this merger put the Navy in charge of the base's operations, including security and law enforcement. Rather than retire the 11th Wing's colors, the Air Force moved it to Andrews. The 11th Wing began in 1933 as the 11th Observation Group, and based at Hickam Field, Hawaii. Monday October 04, 2010
