EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a hawk facing dexter, wings displayed Proper, in dexter talon a lightning bolt bend-sinisterwise, in sinister talon a key bendwise, wards to dexter downward Or, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "318TH OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The swooping hawk symbolizes the agility, precision and lethality with which the Squadron executes its mission. The key signifies the intelligence aspect of their mission, delivering timely, accurate information to support their efforts. The lightning bolt represents the cyber piece of the mission, crafting relevant, validated tactics to cyberspace warfighters.
