2152 Communications Squadron emblem: The 2152 Communications Squadron is a multifaceted organization that provides support for the 321 Strategic Missile Wing and the 319 Bombardment Wing at Grand Forks Air Force Base. The squadron provides communications and air traffic control services as well as the maintenance services in support of these missions. Communications, represented by the telephone, takes care of all communications on Grand Forks AFB, and the numerous missile sites in the area. This duty includes not only the telephone systems, but the message center and numerous radio systems, both classified and unclassified, in use at the base. The tower represents air traffic control which provides services for the 319 Bombardment Wing, the 321 CSG, an "ACE" detachment, and an air rescue detachment at the base. The approach control is part of the National Airspace System and handles civil operations at Grand Forks International Airport which includes the University of North Dakota Flight School. The antenna represents maintenance, which includes maintaining air traffic control's radar and radios, cables and communications at the missile sites, and the communications network around the base.
