3706th Basic Military Training Squadron emblems

320th Training Squadron emblem: Azure, a pair of lightning bolts saltirewise enhanced Or, surmounted by an eagle ascending Proper grasping in both talons a rolled scroll Argent banded Gules, all within a diminished bordure of the second. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle represents the freedom of our country and embodies the service, dedication and courage the unit commits to its country's protection. The lightning bolts denote the swiftness with which the squadron accomplishes its mission. The banded rolled scroll reflects the training function of the unit and its commitment to provide the best military professionals. (Approved, 24 Jun 1996)
