

# Decorations

### EMBLEM

321 Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border, in base a yellow arm and open hand below a gray and white atom with red nucleus. Attached below the disc a blank gray scroll. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the

Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem symbolizes the concept of peace in the palm of our hands. The atom represents strength as embodied in the nuclear power we possess. The outstretched hand represents the willingness to use that power for peace and friendship. The black and white rings of the atom symbolize the two-fold use of nuclear power: white for peaceful purposes and black for war and destructive means. (Approved, 11 Oct 1973)
