3701st Basic Military Training Squadron emblems

321st Training Squadron emblems: Azure, three flight symbols ascending and radiant in chief Gules

garnished Or each issuing a contrail to base Argent, overall a torch of the third flammant Proper and winged White; all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The three flight symbols represent the unit's support to the Air Force mission. They also depict triangles, the symbol in Greek theology for change, reflecting the changing environment to which personnel must adapt. The winged torch suggests the imparting of specific knowledge to support the Air Force mission. (Approved, 24 Jun 1996)
