#### **EMBLEM**

Per pale argent and azure, two lightning flashes saitirewise crossed at the upper ends or, surmounting a palm frond in base vert, in chief a lightning flash fesswise of the third all overall and within a diminished border of the first. The emblem is symbolic of the Division's primary mission. The divided background of white and blue represents day, night, or the around the clock defensive mission. It also symbolizes fair and foul weather which is penetrated by the all-weather weapons systems. The crossed electronic emissions in the center of the emblem signify surveillance by means of radar. The horizontal electronic emission denotes the electronic controlled weapon as a cap completing the weapon system. The palm branch represents victory. The dominant colors of the emblem ultramarine blue and golden yellow reflect the official Air Force colors. (Approved, 9 Dec 1958)

## **OPERATIONS**

The 327th assumed responsibility for the defense of the Mariana Islands against air attack in Jul 1957. To accomplish this mission, the division controlled the 832d Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron, and the 41st Fighter-Interceptor Squadron. In addition to Air Force training, these units also trained with naval organizations and participated in military exercises. In Feb 1966, the division assumed responsibility for Air Force units in the Taiwan Island area. Until Jan 1976, it provided logistics, administrative, and service support for military and U.S. Government agencies on Taiwan. In addition, it coordinated air defense operations and plans with the Chinese Air Force to integrate combined forces into the overall Pacific Command. In fulfilling its mission, the 327th participated in numerous military exercises such as Eagle, Lark, and Blue Sky.
