

#### **EMBLEM**





On a disc divided per pale red and blue, a white pale charged with a white torch outlined and shaded gray enflamed red, the base of the torch enveloped by a red atomic symbol. Over all in fess a gold key, shaded brown, the key handle a training lure, the disc within a gold border. Emblem between two white scrolls edged blue - lower scroll inscribed in gold capital letters. The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The key to future preparedness is represented by the key and atomic symbol. The torch, a symbol of learning and the training lure allude to the squadron's primary mission. The emblem bears the National colors and the Air Force colors - gold and ultramarine blue.
