Initiated in February 1922 at San Francisco, CA. Relocated on 28 January 1930 to Los Angeles, CA. Redesignated as the 334th Balloon Squadron on 1 October 1933. Inactivated on 30 July 1940 at Los Angeles by relief of personnel. Conducted annual summer training at Ross Field, CA. Status: Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
