EMBLEM

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged, compass indicates the engineering support provided by the unit to the flying and space mission. The ogress, a heraldic symbol for cannon shot, reflects the unit's contribution to the nation's defense.
