MISSION

The 341 Maintenance Operation Squadron supports all maintenance activities affecting 150 Minuteman III launch facilities and 15 missile alert facilities. The squadron plans and monitors production efforts of more than 720 maintenance technicians and conducts all ancillary and technical training, ensuring job proficiency and mission readiness. They provide back shop maintenance in seven diverse sections: electronics laboratory, aircraft aerospace ground equipment, pneudraulics, mechanical, vehicles, equipment and power, refrigeration and electrical systems. The 341 MOS also ensures readiness of Air Force Space Command's largest nuclear-certified vehicle fleet valued at \$17M. The squadron provides weapons system technical expertise and oversees programming and budget execution for the 341 Maintenance Group.

EMBLEM



Azure (dark blue), issuant from base a demi-globe azure gridlined of the first surmounted by a sword palewise silver gray garnished dark blue, grip gules, between in chief four mullets arcing in chief argent; all within a diminished bordure yellow. Attached below the disc a dark blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The stars on a dark blue disc denote the four missile squadrons which the unit supports and also the space environment for the squadron's parent organization [Air Force Space Command]. The globe suggests the worldwide operational capabilities of the unit. The sword symbolizes the focused commitment of squadron personnel to the defense of peace. (Approved, 2 May 1995)
