## **OPERATIONS**

The Combat Cargo Groups were to be self-contained groups, capable of being 100% operational and always ready to go at a moments notice. To that end, each Combat Cargo Squadron was to

have an Airdrome Squadron assigned with it. Each Airdrome Squadrons mission was to supply all tasks, including everything (from cooking to aircraft maintenance), necessary for the Combat Cargo Squadron to be self-sufficient. Both of these groups would function as one unit. Each of the Combat Cargo Groups was to consist of four Squadrons, each with 25 aircraft (originally C-47's).
