The general mission of the 351st Civil Engineering Squadron is to provide the assets and skilled personnel to prepare and sustain global installations as stationary platforms for the projection of aerospace power in peace and war. The specific mission of the squadron is to maintain, repair and provide all base and missile field facilities and utilities; design, construction oversight, and quality assurance of construction and service contracts; fire protection and prevention services; and management of all military family housing units in support of the 351st Strategic Missile Wing.

To meet these missions the squadron manages the following resources: three annual budgets which are in excess of \$25.0 million and represent approximately 60 percent of all base O & M funds, authorization of 174 civilian workers with 189 assigned; 12 officers with 10 assigned; 293 enlisted personnel with 258 assigned to accomplish the assigned mission, and a civilian workforce in the squadron which represents over 50 percent of all base civilian employees.
