652nd Bombardment Squadron (Heavy, Weather Reconnaissance) On a yellow disc, border light turquoise blue, a caricatured, white duck, facing toward sinister, with orange bill and feet, wearing a dark gray, swallowtail coat and derby, holding a folded umbrella of the last in the tip of the left wing, and a thermometer, proper, under the right wing, standing beneath a large, threatening, gray cloud in dexter chief, with four, small, jagged, red lightning flashes emanating there from, and the laughing face of the sun golden orange over the border in sinister chief, with black ray lines issuing there from. (Approved, 21 Feb 1945)
