Attached above the disc an Olive Drab scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "354TH COMPTROLLER SQUADRON" in Black letters. Attached below the disc an Olive Drab scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ANY PLACE—ANY TIME" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors.
