On a light green disc, a diagonal stripe from dexter chief to sinister base divided white between blue above and scarlet below, overall a folded United States flag proper surmounted by three heads in profile, black between white, and a yellow cornucopia detailed black arcing from above the heads to sinister base and filled with multicolored fruits; all within a narrow blue border. Attached above the disc a yellow scroll edged with a narrow blue border. Attached below the disc a yellow scroll edged with a narrow blue border and inscribed READY TO SERVE in blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The Emblem represent the various aspects of the services mission of the profile represent the people served by the squadron. This includes lodging and dining hall service (indicated by the cornucopia). The folded flag represents the honor guard and the interment services performed by them. (Approved, 23 Sep 1988)

The 354th Force Support Squadron will become official today (April 29) during a ceremony at Eielson AFB, Alaska. The Air Force selected Eielson in January 2007 as one of six bases at which to test the force-shaping initiative of merging mission support and service units into a single consolidated force support squadron. A provisional FSS stood up at Eielson last Duly during the test period. The Air Force approved the new permanent FSS structure April 1. The base's new FSS includes five flights: force development, manpower and personnel, airman and family services, sustainment services, and community services.
