EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, issuant from base a demi-globe Celeste, gridlined and fimbriated Or, surmounted by a cross Gules, ascending from the demi-globe, three spires arcing to sinister chief, nombril and dexter chief Argent, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "359TH MEDICAL SUPPORT SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The demi-globe represents the unit's commitment to expeditionary global support. The red cross signifies the blood of life, and it is the time-honored symbol of the combat medic.
