Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 29 July 1921 as the 360th Squadron (Observation), assigned to the XV Corps and allotted to the Fifth Corps Area. Initiated in April 1922 at Cincinnati, OH. Redesignated as the 360th Observation Squadron on 25 January 1923. Assigned on 31 March 1924 to the 332nd Observation Group (XV Corps). Inactivated by March 1930 at Cincinnati by relief of personnel. Bowman Field, KY, designated on 21 December 1933 as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location. Withdrawn from the Organized Reserve on 1 January 1938 and allotted to the Regular Army. Conducted summer training at Bowman Field, KY, and Selfridge Field, MI.
