- Surgical Operations Squadron

The group also maintains a 10-bed hospital and care is provided in the following specialty areas: family practice, internal medicine, pediatrics, general surgery, obstetrics/gynecology, flight medicine, psychiatry, radiology, pharmacy, clinical laboratory, dietetics, optometry, physical therapy and 24-hour urgent care center. Specialty services beyond the capability of the 366th MDG are referred to other military facilities through the aeromedical evacuation system or through local civilian sources.
