Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as Air Park No. 374, assigned to the 329th Observation Group (GHQR), and allotted to the Ninth Corps Area. Initiated on 14 February 1922 at Los Angeles, CA. Redesignated as the 374th Service Squadron on 25 January 1923. Relieved from assignment to the 329th Observation Group on 31 March 1924 and assigned to the 349th Bombardment Group (GHQR). Inactivated on 1 September 1928 at Los Angeles by relief of personnel. Consolidated on 27 November 1936 with the 373rd Aero Squadron (a WWI unit organized in January 1918 at Waco Field, TX; demobilized in March 1919 at Garden City, NY; reconstituted on 27 November 1936). Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
