MISSION

The 375th Communications Support Squadron supports the 375th Airlift Wing in its global reach mission by providing, command, control, communications and computer support to DoD, USTRANSCOM, AMC, 18th AF and ports worldwide. The squadron is comprised of five flights:

The Information Assurance Flight manages and administers the COMSEC and EMSEC programs for AMC while also providing guidance and direction to AMC on certification and accreditation of information systems and networks. Manage and administer the COMPUSEC program for all Scott organizations with connectivity to the Scott Metropolitan Area Network.

The Software Engineering Flight develops software applications for AMC customers that speed decision making and get personnel and cargo to their destination more rapidly.

The Missions Systems Flight provides world class operation and maintenance support for command and control and transportation systems used by USTRANSCOM, AMC and the TACC to accomplish their worldwide mission.

The Mobility Operations Flight provides 24- hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week command and control of AMC's network encompassing 11 bases, 18 C2 systems in more than 150 locations and critical assets throughout the world in support of AMC's global mission. They serve as the single communications coordination focal point for all of AMC.

The Mobility Systems Flight provides world-class operations and maintenance support for the Global Command and Control System, Global Support System, AMC Deployment Analysis System, Consolidated Air Mobility Planning System, Command and Control Information Processing System, and AMC Transportation systems.

The Software Verification Flight provides quality assurance testing for all systems and software that is developed in 375th CSPTS. Through their efforts they ensure all their products meet the set standards of accuracy, reliability, interoperability and security.

EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a wizard Buff, couped at the knees in tri-aspect dexter shoulder to front, robed Purpure, hair and beard Silver Gray, eyes Or, his dexter hand grasping a globe of the first, gridlined of the fourth, radiating from behind and between twenty-five rays of the fifth, and grasping in his sinister hand, garnished with a ring Yellow, a sword bendwise to chief charged with seventeen lightning flashes of the last, guard and pommel of the fourth, grip of the third, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disk, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "WARRIOR WIZARDS NOT WITHOUT US" in Black letters. Attached below the disk, a Silver Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "375TH COMMUNICATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The robed wizard symbolizes the Airman's commitment to joint operations. The electrified sword held aloft and ready represents weapon systems, communications, and power able to come to bear at a moment's notice. The wizard's right hand rests protectively on the globe with a powerful aura symbolizing faster worldwide communications. (Approved, 21 March 2008)
