On a disc Gules, an orle of rays Or charged with a heurt bearing a bezant, overall an eagle in profile erased and resting with wing extended to dexter, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MISSION ENABLERS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "376 EFSS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The orle represents the unwavering dedication of Squadron members to accomplish their mission in a deployed location. The eagle symbolizes the professional strength demonstrated by unit personnel proudly serving the United States Air Force. The Squadron motto, "Mission Enablers," describes the extraordinary and tireless capabilities of unit personnel in moving the warfighters to the battle front.
