EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, two stylized hands Gules in base supporting a sphere of the field, gridlined Argent environed by a contrail Sable terminating in a delta of the second point to dexter, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "TO SERVE AND SUSTAIN" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "403D FORCE SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. A pair of hands holding a globe signifies the global support provided by the Force Support Squadron. The delta and contrail represent the continuous cycle between home station and deployments. All the elements combined convey the merging of personnel and services and the all-encompassing reach of the Squadron. (Approved, 14 Mar 2016)
