## **OPERATIONS**

Constituted in the Organized Reserve 15 October 1921 as the 14th Airdrome Company, assigned to the Fifth Army, and allotted to the Fourth Corps Area. Initiated in January 1922 at Memphis, TN. Redesignated on the 404th Airdrome Company 25 January 1923. Relieved from the Fifth Army 31 March 1924 and assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve. Redesignated on 404th Airdrome Squadron 1 October 1933. Conducted summer training at Maxwell Field, AL 1922-33. Designated mobilization training station was Camp Joseph E. Johnston, FL (later redesignated Camp J. Clifford R. Foster) 1922-30 and Maxwell Field, AL 1930-36. Withdrawn from the Fourth Corps Area 5 June 1936 and allotted to the Second Corps Area. Further allotted 5 April 1937 to the Metropolitan District, Southern New York Reserve Area. Mitchel Field, NY, designated as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location.
