#### **NICKNAME**

#### **OPERATIONS**

Trained in fighter-bomber and air defense operations after activation in England, 1952-1953. Provided air defense in United Kingdom, 1954-1958 and in the Netherlands 1954-1955.

Phased down for inactivation, Feb-May 1958.

Replaced the 406th Tactical Fighter Training Group in July 1972.

Assumed responsibility for operating and maintaining Zaragoza AB, Spain, its associated gunnery ranges, and air combat tactics training areas. Combat units of the United States Air Forces in Europe deployed weapons training detachments (WTD) to Zaragoza for training. The 406th provided full support and temporarily controlled these detachments, although it had no tactical squadrons or permanently assigned aircraft.

Attached WTDs often participated in tactical exercises, as well as range training. Beginning in 1976, the Wing operated the USAFE Tactical Forces Employment School and USAFE Instructor Pilot School.

The 406<sup>th</sup> began full support of a KC-135 detachment on a permanent basis in 1976, adding 10 KC-10 during the Persian Gulf War, 1990-1991.

Prepared Zaragoza AB, for closure and return to Spanish AF control at the end of 1992.
