MISSION

The 412th Flight Test Squadron, commonly called Speckled Trout—a name synonymous with the organization and the aircraft—performs a dual mission: providing worldwide transportation to senior USAF and DoD leaders while, often at the same time, testing advanced avionics and communications. It performs this mission with one aircraft, a highly modified C-135C. With an interior similar to a civilian airliner, the Trout can comfortably transport 35 passengers and crew. And, because many of its missions are international, the long over-water flights make the aircraft ideally suited for testing a variety of navigation, communications and tracking systems in different regions of the world.

OPERATIONS

The 412th Flight Test Squadron was activated at Edwards on 1 January 1994, although Project Speckled Trout as a unit dates to 1957 when General Curtis E. LeMay, then Vice Chief of Staff of the Air Force, ordered the transfer of the last test bed KC-135 from Edwards to Andrews AFB, Maryland, to perform a mission of executive airlift. That aircraft served until 1974 when it was replaced with the current aircraft. The unit was named Speckled Trout in honor of its freckled-faced program manager, Faye Trout.

The 412th Flight Test Squadron at Edwards AFB, Calif., officially inactivated in a ceremony there earlier this month, bringing an end to the unit's combined senior leader airlift and test mission, officials announced. The squadron's single modified KC-135 "Speckled Trout" aircraft will shift solely to the test support role with Edwards' 418th FLTS, according to a May 20 release "It's the only KC-135 on base that's receiver capable, so we're planning on using it as part of the testing with the KC-46," said former 412th FLTS Commander Lt. Col. Michael Davis. Gen. Curtis LeMay directed the modification of a KC-135 to transport senior Air Force leaders in 1957 and "the Trout in its various forms and squadrons has transported 15 Chiefs of Staff over the years," Col. Rodney Todaro, 412th Operations Group commander said. The 412th FLTS stood up Jan. 1, 1994. 2015
