## EMBLEM

On a disc Celeste, a sphere Vert gridlined and fimbriated Azure, superimposed in chief by a cross

couped Gules, bearing a caduceus Or, all behind an arched contrail issuant from sinister to dexter terminating to a mullet Tennè (Golden Orange), all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "413TH AEROMED STAGING SQUADRON" in Blue letters. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "ONE TEAM TRAINED AND READY" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background of the emblem symbolizes air power that the unit strives to support. The shooting star signifies excellence in all the Squadron does. The caduceus combined with the cross denotes the widely recognized traditional symbol for the medical profession. The globe is a direct reflection of the unit's mobility and global reach.
