EMBLEM

A white diamond-shaped area edged black, charged with an Air Force blue cone-shaped missile in pale, nose to chief, leaving a trail of-red flame to base encircled by a black gear showing thirteen teeth; all between two Air Force golden yellow lightning bolts in chief radiating from nose of missile and between in dexter and in sinister respectively, two sets of a wrench and screwdriver green, in saltire, handle of screwdriver black. On an orange scroll above the emblem, edged and inscribed in black, REPARARE ET REDDBRE, Repair and Return. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Our emblem symbolizes our squadron's mission. The wrench and screwdriver are representative of the tools the mechanics use in repairing various parts of the aircraft represented by the gear. The four tools and the thirteen teeth in the gear represent the 413th designation of the squadron. The gear indicates the machinists and their repair capability. The two bolts of lightning without jagged edges signify the speed and electronics of supersonic fighters. The cone-shaped blue object signifies missiles and their repair. The red flame indicates jet-type aircraft. Black and orange, used on the scroll, are the adopted colors of the Squadron. Red, blue, green, and yellow are the colors of the tactical squadrons which we support. (Approved, 7 Feb 1953)
